



Nico Müller

29/08/2026 For the 2025/2026 season, Nico Müller moved from the Porsche customer team Andretti Formula E to the Porsche works team in the ABB FIA Formula E World Championship. The Porsche works driver had previously gained experience in the highly efficient Porsche 99X Electric for a season with the racing team of US motorsport legend Michael Andretti.

In October 2025, Müller succeeded António Félix da Costa in the Porsche works team – alongside the 2023/2024 Drivers' World Champion, Pascal Wehrlein. "I want to contribute as quickly as possible to ensuring the team can build on its recent successes," said the Swiss-born driver after the works team completed Porsche's Formula E title collection by winning the Manufacturers' and Teams' World Championships shortly before Müller's move.

In his very first season with the Porsche Formula E Team, Müller backed up his words with actions and delivered his best Formula E season to date. He celebrated his first race win and his first pole position in Formula E, as well as two podium finishes. In doing so, Müller also played his part in Porsche securing its second Manufacturers' World Championship at the end of the 2025/2026 season.

Müller has been competing in Formula E since the 2019/2020 season, taking a break only for the

2021/2022 season. Müller brings extensive experience in single-seater racing from the early days of his motorsport career. He has also competed in numerous other racing series, including the FIA World Endurance Championship, the FIA World Rallycross Championship, and the DTM, where he finished runner-up in 2019 and 2020. Müller also celebrated overall victory at the Nürburgring 24 Hours in 2015.
